MY DEAR PEOPLE,

On Whit-Sunday, the birthday of the Church, there will be celebrations of the Holy Communion at 7, 8 and 11 a.m. There never was a time when the Church needed more of the Gift of the Holy Spirit to guide her into all truth, and our earnest prayer at this time should be for a larger measure of the "Inspiration of God's Holy Spirit" both for the Church and the Nation.

This number of the magazine is largely concerned with the various parochial and other funds, I hope you will read them very carefully. There are still very many of our Church people who contribute little towards the *corporate* work of the Church, and while it is essential that our parochial organizations shall be duly supported, it is incumbent for us to bear in mind the needs of the Church as a whole—one means by which this is done is by the Free-will Offering Scheme, particulars of which will be found elsewhere.

In common with the whole country the Day School Children celebrated Empire Day by assembling in the Recreation ground, singing patriotic songs and saluting the flag. There was a large attendance of parents and friends.

I am glad to hear of the revival of the Hampton Hill Cricket Club. Mr. H. E. Clement is acting as Secretary and Treasurer, and will be glad to receive subscriptions.

The Girl Guides gave a delightful Concert on May 14th, when the boys' school was crowded and the financial result was very good. The concert is to be repeated in the Town Hall, Twickenham, on Thursday, June 12th. Tickets may be obtained of Mrs. Meynell.

The Annual Church Cleaning takes place on Monday, June 2nd, and there will be no week-day services that week; one or two additional voluntary workers are needed, Mrs. C. H. Carpenter will gladly give particulars.

The Annual Distribution of cups, medals, badges, etc., in connection with the Church Lads' Brigade was held in the Drill Hall, on May 20th. An excellent report of the past year's work of the Company was presented by Capt. Basey, who received the congratulation of Major Cooke and others.

The work of the Girls' Friendly Society will be specially remembered at the 8 a.m. celebration on June 15th.

I ask your prayers on behalf of the Candidates from this Parish who will be confirmed at Holy Trinity, Twickenham, on June 29th.

Our thanks are due to Miss Roberts for defraying the cost of re-varnishing the seat in the churchyard and to the Misses Betts and Miss Barnes for kindly cleaning the church flags.

We congratulate George Arthur Davis, of the Boys' School, on winning an industrial scholarship.

## FREEWILL OFFERING FUND.

Each member of the congregation is specially asked to help this fund by a small regular contribution. The financial management of the principal Church Societies in the diocese (except the Missionary Societies) is now under one control, *i.e.*, the Council of the London Diocese Fund of which the Bishop of London is President, and Lord Justice Bankes is Chairman. This body is making a great effort to organise the diocese so as to secure the best results with the money available. Among the Societies which depend on the Diocese Fund for money are the Bishop of London's Fund, East London Church Fund, Queen Victoria Clergy Fund, Church Schools Association, Sunday School Council, Council for Welfare of Lads, Board of Missions, Clergy Widows' Fund, Clergy Pension Institution, Additional Curates' Society, Pastoral Aid Society, and Scripture Readers' Association.

Every Parish in the diocese is asked to send each year a named sum and Hampton Hill's quota for 1919 is £52.

You may pay weekly, monthly or quarterly as you prefer, and small collecting envelopes can be obtained from the Verger.
