MY DEAR FRIENDS.

I have pleasure in drawing attention to the additional list of subscriptions, etc., for the ORGAN FUND. The Churchwardens and I will be very glad to receive the outstanding promises as soon as possible, as the first payment will be due to the Builders at the beginning of October. Messrs. Hele & Son have promised that the work shall be completed by the second week in November, which will soon be here now. It will be seen that the amount yet required is less than £150. Will our friends help us to bring it down to less than £100 by the opening day?

The Annual Meeting in connection with the NURSE FUND was held on August 7th. The audited accounts were presented by Miss Lavington, and they will be found printed below. Miss Lavington was re-elected Secretary, and the Committee was re-appointed. It will be seen that there was a balance in hand at the end of the year, but we shall need a good many new subscribers to carry us through the year.

I am glad to say a new Curate has been appointed. Mr. F. St. Clair Goldie, who is a B.A. of the University of Wales, and who is now at Oxford for a short time completing his studies. He will come, if all is well, in Advent, and I am sure you will give him a warm welcome. We have been very glad to have the temporary help of the Rev. H. M. Kirkby, who is the rector of a parish outside New York. The Rev. T. G. JOHNSON, formerly Vicar of St. Thomas's, Launceston, is coming to help until Mr. Goldie can come.

The Harvest Festival is fixed for Friday, October 4th. The preacher in the morning at 11 will be the Rev. J. B. OST, missionary from mid-China, and the offertory will be for the C.M.S. The preacher in the evening will be the Rev. E. E. CHARLES, M.A., Vicar of Hampton, and the offertory will be for our Day Schools. The festival services will be continued on the Sunday following, when the offertories will be for the Curate's Fund. The weather recently has been so deplorable that our sympathies are entirely with the poor farmers, who must be having a most anxious time, and some people are wondering whether it is not a little out of place to have a Harvest Thanksgiving at all this year, but it should be remembered that the festival is more and more being looked upon as a special thanksgiving for all the mercies of the year; for commerce, for peace, for health, and the thousand blessings that are continually falling upon us. We all have much to be thankful for, and this is the occasion to show it. I hope that there will be no lack of a warm expression of gratitude this year, which will show itself in your attendance at the services and in your offerings. Gifts of corn, fruit and flowers will be gratefully received.

By recent removals from the parish we have lost several helpers. I am very anxious that the vacancies should be filled at once. We want three District Visitors, and some helpers for the Band of

Hope. I shall be most grateful if anyone who can help will offer their services.

I want all our Sunday School Teachers to know that a course of five Lectures on "Sunday School Work and the Art of Teaching" will be given by the Director of Sunday Schools, the Rev. H. A. LESTER, M.A., on Tuesday evenings, commencing October 22nd, at 8.30 p.m. in St. Stephen's Hall, East Twickenham, three minutes from St. Margarets Station, and about an equal distance from the tram line to Brentford. It is earnestly hoped that as many of our teachers as possible will make use of them. There is no charge for admission.

I am asked to mention that a Cinematograph Exhibition of Missionary Work in Japan is being organized by the Missionary Laymen's Union, to be held in Twickenham Town Hall, on Monday, November 4th. This preliminary notice is given that friends may keep the day open.
